## 2003 NORTH ADIRONDACK REGIONAL ENVIROTHON WINNERS

**Paul Smiths, NY** — Twenty eight teams from seventeen schools around Clinton, Essex, Franklin and St. Lawrence Counties competed at the 2003 Annual North Adirondack Regional Envirothon (NARE) on Wednesday, May 7th, 2003. The NARE Committee is pleased to announce the winners in this environmental competition.

High scores in each of the five test categories received ribbons and a \$30 gift certificate for books for their school's library. The winners were Lake Placid Lakers for Aquatics, Franklin Academy Fauna for Forestry, Chateaugay Central Bulldogs for Soils, Canton High X for Wildlife, and Saranac Lake Newbies for Current Issue.

The highest scoring teams on all tests for each county received hats, a plaque and advance to the State Envirothon. The winners were: Clinton County - North Country Home School Forever Wild, Essex County - Lake Placid Lakers, Franklin County - Saranac Lake Soil Kings, and St. Lawrence County - Canton High X. The team with the overall highest score, receiving personalized embroidered vests and a special plaque, was Canton High X who scored 93 out of a possible 125.

For the sixth year, the Envirothon for the four northern New York Counties of Clinton, Essex, Franklin, and St. Lawrence was held at Paul Smith's College. The North Adirondack Regional Envirothon (NARE) is coordinated by the four County Soil and Water Conservation Districts (SWCD), the New York Power Authority, Paul Smith's College, and Cedar Eden Environmental.
